Janet Lyman has been teaching since 1967. She studied at the Manhattan School of Music in New York, receiving a B.M. and an M.M. Ed. She is Director of Music at Zion Lutheran Church in Clark where she established a brass and string ensemble and conducts the Adult and Youth Choir. Ms. Lyman was string advisor to WYACT/NJPAC Summer Musicals and has conducted the North Jersey Junior Regional Orchestra. In 2003 she started and directed a Hand Bell Choir at Zion Lutheran Church in Clark, NJ.

Her credits include conducting a performance of young musicians at Carnegie Hall as part of the "Salute to Music" program. Ms. Lyman has received many honors and awards including the Lincoln Center Award, Educator of the Year Award by the Citizen's Education Council of Tenafly, the New Jersey Governor's Teacher Recognitions Program, and the New Jersey Commissioner's Symposium for Outstanding Teaching.

Ms. Lyman is on the faculty of The New Jersey Workshop for the Arts in Westfield where she teaches violin, Clarinet, trumpet, saxophone, cello and many other instruments. She has been the conductor of the NJ Workshop Summer Symphony for many years. She also is the conductor of The Wednesday Morning Strings, a traveling group that performs at nursing homes, assisted living facilities and long term in-patient hospitals.
